Trying to eliminate this many players in 1 hour is not recommended.

Whether you are playing for \$1000, \$1, or bragging rights, each player starts with 1000 chips. Determine how many players you have and how long you want the tournament to last and find out the corresponding time limit for each level on the grid. For example: if you have 20 players and you want the tournament to last 2 hours, the time limit for each level is 12 Minutes. All tournaments start at level 1 and proceed until 1 player has all the chips. Start each stack with 8 \$25 chips 8 \$100 chips.
